We are introducing some new mathematical resources to explore pattern, shape, and size, as well as thinking about the pattern and sequence of the daily routine (using language such as first, now, next, after and later). Linked to our core book we are learning about size (small, medium and large), length (short, longer, longer, shorter) height (short, shorter, shortest, tall, taller, tallest) the numbers 1,2,3 and ordering (first, second, third).

..to create and tell a story of our own

Our core book is the traditional tale, Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We are reading different versions and noticing the similarities and differences between the versions. We are using story maps to re-tell the story and creating our own actions. We will be continuing to think about characters, settings, problems and solutions in our Tales Toolkit story sessions and adapting stories with our own characters and ideas. We will be using our voice sounds, creating different voices for the characters—a deep, gruff

voice for daddy bear, a high voice for mummy bear and a tiny, squeaky voice for baby bear. Why not use the story map attached to re-tell the story together at home.

We are also learning some related songs. See the attached lyrics and links.
